We all know friends and family members who are not touched by Goodrich UMC on a regular basis and it could be that our effort is all it will take to change a family's life.

When we joined Goodrich United Methodist Church, we pledged to be disciples for Jesus Christ and spread the Word of God. This stewardship campaign is a chance for all of us to be good disciples. Members specifically pledge their prayers, presence, gifts, service and witness for the Church of Jesus Christ and specifically for GUMC.

However, many of us are daunted by approaching our friends and neighbors or even our family members about our faith and about our church. It will take some mentoring for the entire congregation. The Church Board and Pastor Joel are fully committed to this Campaign and promise to give our congregation the chance to learn how to be good disciples. SCRIP—Gifts, Everyday Use, You Name It!

Have you ever ordered from Scrip? This is a way that the United Methodist Women support the making of their Ugly Quilts. These quilts, which are creatively sewn into sleeping bags, are taken to Flint and are then distributed by agencies to the homeless. You may order gift cards from popular stores and eateries, who commit to contribute a certain percentage of the cost of each card to our ministry. You can order and pay on the first Sunday of each month and receive your gift card order on the second Sunday. Start thinking of good Christmas gifts to buy! Pause With Pastor Joel . . .

The day after our wedding, Megan and I sat down to open wedding gifts. One gift was a card from a friend from seminary. This was a friendship that started from a class project, when we were placed in the same group. While we had grown close enough that we had invited this friend to our wedding, I was still surprised when inside the card we found a check for \$500.

This was one of the largest gifts we received and certainly the largest gift we received from someone who was not our family. It is a gift that has stayed with me. I was astounded that this friend could be so generous to us. I'm the type of person that is usually wondering what to spend on a gift - is \$50 dollars enough?

It was the type of gift that left me feeling humble. Interestingly, it was also the type of gift that left me feeling that in the future I wanted to pass this kind of love on to other people if I could. I do not have the resources to give \$500 for a gift at every wedding I attend. However, such an extravagant gift has changed the way that I give to others at their weddings.

The 1st Letter of John 4:19 says, "We love because he first loved us." I often think of this verse when I think about giving. In many senses, I give because I first received. The gift at my wedding certainly had that influence: it made me more of a giver to others.

It's the time of year when we ask people to consider the gifts they give to the church. The same way that I responded to that generous wedding gift is how I respond when considering my gift to the church. I give because I first received. Here I'm speaking not about gifts from others, but from God. I have received so much from God. I have received scholarships that enabled me to go to school; I have received gifts that enabled me to become a pastor in order to make a living; I have received the gift of a sense of humor that helps me to get others to laugh. Those are just a few examples.

I have been richly blessed and because of that I give in accordance to those gifts. I hope that you feel the same way. I hope that you give because you recognize God's gifts in your life. I pray you are aware of how richly blessed you are by God. I hope that this season as we ask you to consider your giving for next year you will be inspired to give in proportion to your blessings.






Prayground Under **Development**



In Matthew 19:14 we hear, "Jesus said, 'Let the little children come to me, and do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of heaven belongs." Some churches have begun to create what they call a "Prayground," a space for children in worship. Studies have found that if children are in worship, even if they are playing, that they are usually paying attention. Our prayground offers a space for children to be a vital part of our worshipping congregation.

We have heard concerns about its placement and we have moved it to the front. Parents, this area is intended for children to play and worship. To other adults in the congregation, it may be noisy at times and for this we apologize. That is the cost of having children as part of our community. If you have a hard time focusing because the children are playing, go and join them. You will never go wrong if you try to become more like a child. Most likely, Jesus would love it.
